Yugoslavia Bozenka Bledsoe & Marilyn Rath____

(This concludes the article on the trip Božie and Marilyn took to Yugoslavia with Leorge Tomov's tour last summer. The first part of the article appeared in last month's Newsletter.)

The next morning early found us on a very hot bus, complete with one of our tour members as a "stewardess" complete with Ride Me hat, offering bread cubes, cheese, a jug of wine, and giving massages, leading old and new sones (some of which were so old that only the 80-year-old on our trip knew the words), dancing in the aisles, etc. We arrived in Dubrovaik late in the evening after our bus took a wrong turn and ended up on a very narrow one-way street going the wrong way. After much maneuvering, shouting, and 50 back-seat drivers, we managed to get to our hotel and a delicious dinner, after which was a bib surprise, a huge birthday cake for Marilyn and champagne. We could hardly wait for morning so we could see the city. Our room opened right on the Adriatic Sea with a perfect view of the old walled city, and the first thing we did the next morning was take the walk around the top of the wall, then up and down the tiny narrow side streets, some of which were narrow stairways. The main street was very wide but none of the streets are open to traffic. We took a boat trip to Lokrum Island where many went swimming, and many visited the "nude" beach (too many equipped with cameras). We attended the opening of the festival, with a sight we will never forget. The entire old city was packed wall to wall with people, and the festival started out with a few performing groups and speeches, after which everyone left the city as fast as they could to get a good vantage point from which to watch the fireworks. They were held in front of the harbor and we've never seen such a display. As soon as these were over, everyone ran back into the city for dancing to musical groups that were on the balconies of the larger buildings, the most impressive being on the balcony of the Sponza Palace. Unfortunately, our time schedule did not permit time for any performances as we had to leave the following day for Zagrep.

we visited the Meskovic Museum and Art Gallery and the open market place where many of our group found costumes but at no bargain prices. We all went to the Zagrebska Pivovarna (brewery) where they had an outdoor terrace and live music for dancing. We attended a performance of the Belgrade Madrigal Singers the following evening. Next stop was Ljubljana, but being Sunday the city was very quiet. We had our "farewell party" at our hotel, complete with awards for "the most tireless shopper," "the girl who had lost 9,738 strands of hair (due to a makeover at a Croatian beauty shop)," and best of all, "the Czechoslovakian in African clothes

speaking Serbo-Croatian (Božie)."

We landed in New York the following afternoon, completely exhausted, but with memories of a fantastic trip which we will never forget. We met many wonderful people, made many new friends, and our lives will never be the same. Watch for Chapter II next year for Božie and Marilyn in Romania.
