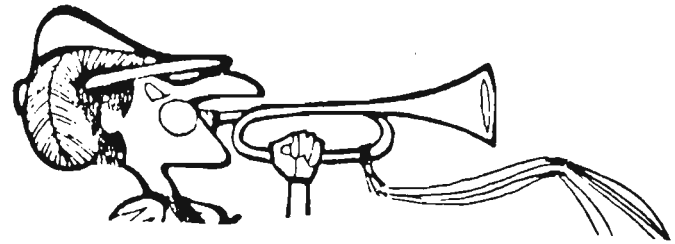

SARASOTA FOLK DANCE NEWS

The hottest news flash from our dance group is that the Babiaks and Judy and Debbie Norris will be flying to Costa Rica at the end of March. They will be sharing international folk dances with the "Tic Amigos" the Costa Rican folk dance group. Perhaps you will recall two of their members attended the Yugoslav tour sponsored by the Babiaks last summer. They also stayed with them and were available to teach their native dances last year. Currently the plans are to expand the repertoire of their group to include more Yugoslavian and Balkan dances. We wish them a safe journey-- and look forward to their return. Hoping, of course, that they have learned more dances from that region to share with us. We know one dance in particular, unique to Sarasota only- because it was choreographed by Shirley Babiak, which will REALLY be popular there: "Flash Dance." Yes, it is true, authentic folk-dance type moves and steps have been coordinated to fit the music to this popular movie! Well, don't be a folk-dance snob, or purist, if you will -- as they say, "Don't knock it 'til you've tried it!" It's great fun to do for any age group, plus you don't need a partner- and you do travel ALL over the dance floor. Just request it, anytime you come Thurs. 7:00 Int'l Folk Dancing on Siesta Key at St. Boniface Episcopal Church. Our January programs seem seasonal--we usually do Yugoslavian and Balkan type dances at our performances around town. Bay Village, a retirement center, was highly receptive to our group. They provided a fine wooden floor stage and set the chairs for the audience in a U shaped fashion for maximum visibility. Ciuliendro, Itele, Dremes, Staro Planinsko, Kalina were some of what we did. Audience participation was rewarding they did Troika, Slavonsko Kolo, and one other one. Shirley introduced each dancer, she described the costumes and the region from which it originated -- the crowd loved it. Also, one in the audience had a beautiful Finnish vest, skirt and blouse on-- she looked like she belonged with us. Many thanked us afterwards and asked questions, they really made us feel welcome.

Our next big event will be on St. Patrick's Day in Bradenton. We are dutifully attending practices to perfect our "7s and 3s" for the Sweets of May dance and the Bridge of Athalone. We slipped an Irish sounding musical number, called Posties Jig (really Scottish) along with Waves of Tory, Siemse Bierta, and a fine dance created just for this occasion, strongly resembling Western Mixer, but done to Irish music.

Wow, our dance instructor is creative, but of course, that's what we love her, just the way she is! Oh, it's called "the Irish Military Waltz" which our local comedienne, Barbara Simmons, promptly dubbed, "the I.R.A. stomp." You other villages of dance just do NOT know what your missing!

Our first dance class in Mar. had a surprise guest dancer--teacher from the Tampa group: Andy Pollock. He managed to get there, a little after 9:00 pm, lucky for him-- we are usually going strong by then. Arkan, Chevorno, Florecica, Elena Mome, and some Romanian and Serbian dances which I've never seen before were done-- we really appreciated his visit! Some of us hope to attend the Greek and Bulgarian workshop in Tampa on March 3. It is really great transfusing new dances into our group. A Polish couple's dance from this year's Camp Ocala has been added to our repertoire, too. We welcome our fellow dancers to join us whenever they are in the area. Thanks again, Andy--those dances really recharged our batteries.

FOLK DANCING!!!

There are people here who not only dance every week, but who have been doing it for years (some as many as 40).
