Something that I feel needs addressing is the way most Int'l FD groups do Greek and Bulgarian line dances such as the Hasapikos. This dance was originally done by a couple of people and a few of their best friends doing steps that they had learned throughout childhood. Most FD groups that I have visited do this dance in one long line around the whole room. This changes the whole feel of the dance and insults the culture that we're trying so hard to preserve. If someone says to you "No more on this line." Do not be insulted but realise that they are trying to preserve the ethnicity of the dance and to recapture the 'feel' of doing this dance in the way the people have done this dance for years & years. This also brings up the 'hold' that is being used to do a particular dance, such as belt, basket or shoulder. If a dance is being done in a particular hold and you are not willing to dance in that manner, then go and start your own line or join another. The whole feel of the line or circle moving in a particular way is destroyed if not everyone is using the same type hold.

GAINESVILLE GOSSIP

The University group which has been in existance off and on for approximately thiry or more years now (one of the longer lived University of Florida Organizations) is alive and kicking. We still meet in Norman Hall Gym on Friday evenings from 8:00 to 11:00 p.m. . However, there is a tendency in recent weeks for people to stay and dance until 11:30 or later. It has reminded me of the times when our ending time was 12:00 and we practically had to push people out the door at 12:30 or later to get them to leave.

A few weeks ago we had a treat when Dora Friedman who has taught Israeli dancing for a long while at the Hillel Center here in town, was a guest teacher at our group. She taught three very nice dances one of which she had learned recently at the Blue Star Camp. Dora is a very exuberant and energetic teacher and all enjoyed her and the dances she taught. Besides teaching folk dancing Dora is also a professor in the African and asain Studies program at the University of Florida.

Andy Pollock joined our group on Friday, April 13. It seems that the Tampa group was not meeting, and he wanted to dance. And he offered to teach some dances to give us a break. Andyj had visited our group a few months ago. We very much enjoyed having him dance with us then, and we were delighted to have him not only dance with us but teach us some dances on this occasion. Andy taught four dances one of which I had never met-Karamfil- which is a very lyrical dance. Everyone enjoyed his teaching and I received some nice comments from folks later regarding his teaching and the dances.

There are two things I would like to mention. One concerns some literature I received from a group called the Society of Folk Dance HIstorians. Among other things this group has an Archives project. They accept donations of archival materials, copy them and then send the originals to the Hoblizelle Theater Arts Collection of the Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center at the University of Texas, Austin. The materials are treated to stop deterioration (which means preservation techniques).

The idea sounds like an interesting one. Just thinka folk dance archives to be a repository of folk dancing in this country! As yet I haven't written to this group for more information but I plan to.

There was an interesting article in The New York Times on Sunday, April 8, 1990 entitled "Folk Dancing in Eastern Europe: What Lies Ahead?" The writer, Anna Kisselgoff, asked the question what would happen to many of these performing groups if new governments reduce or eliminate the subsidies these folk dance ensembles have enjoyed for more than 40 years.
