

Fall Fling is a full day of request dancing. The dancers mostly set the program themselves by placing cards on the request board in the order in which they will be danced. On occasion the masters (and mistresses) of ceremonies may intervene to prevent too long a run of dances which are too hard, too easy, or too much of one nationality. But over the years the self-programming has worked well and everybody has been mindful of the needs and interests of others. Dancers at all levels are welcome. To be sure the program will be geared to the more experienced dancer, but many, many dances will be accessible to relatively new dancers. There will be little teaching, although we will briefly walk through dances that require interaction among all the dancers so that everyone can enjoy the dance together.

The format on Saturday will be similar to previous years. We'll set up and start dancing by 11 in the morning. Around noon, we'll set up tables and have a potluck lunch. Then, back to dancing. We'll break again at suppertime. A smoked turkey, roast pork, or something similar may appear courtesy of John and Barbara to help supplement the leftovers from lunch. And we can bring in more food if we need it. Following supper, we'll dance again until everybody is worn out or 11:00 pm, whichever comes first. We do have to pay for use of the hall, so there will be an offering basket. If everyone puts in \$4.00 we should come out about right. We've also rented the Hall for Sunday and plan an informal morning for those who may not have gotten enough on Saturday. Sunday may tend to be more couple dances. We can adjust plans to suit people's interest but the present plan is to start at 9:00 and break up around lunchtime.

Our Flings are always sort of impromptu happenings. Come and help us work it all out.
